9. 45am Devotional Service

This takes place every Sunday morning excluding the 1st Sunday in the month. This Service is facilitated by a Church member. It is Devotional in orientation, is an open Service and attendees are encouraged (optional) to take part through reading of Scripture; sharing of testimonies; choose a hymn/Worship song etc. This Service offers you the opportunity to be still; Seek God and listen to what God through the Holy Spirit is saying; to share; encourage ; bless and share in the Believers Breaking of Bread.

11.00am Family Service

This is a traditionally structured family Service. It is led from the front by the Pastor of the Church (1st and 2nd of the month) and invited speakers thereafter.

2.30pm Agape Fellowship Meeting (1st Sunday ONLY)

This is a 'MUST' for all. It takes place every 1st Sunday. We recognise the fact that increasingly Christians are becoming more isolated and marginalized hence this Service. It is more of a celebration/fellowship meeting. We share a meal (bring and share). This follows on after our usual tea/coffee recess. The gathering gives insight into the Church and the opportunity to meet Church members. We also recognise that we have a number who travel in and miss out on fellowship hence the need to be part of the family and enjoy each other's fellowship. Knowle Green remains unspoilt and is a designated 'Area of natural outstanding beauty'. On a good day take the opportunity to explore the Ribble Valley. If you have not come prepared (brought food with you) please do still join us. Your fellowship means a lot to us.

New addition to Our Services 6.30pm Gospel Evening Service

This takes place every 2nd Sunday evening. The service is Gospel in content, offers the opportunity and a different forum to bring / invite friends and neighbours. The Service includes sharing the Word, testimonies, time of worship and fellowship. Start time is 6.30pm. Now that the day light is extending do come and join us.

'**Praying without faith is like trying to illuminate an electric light without believing in electricity'. (Author unknown)** Is it Scriptural to believe in God and not have faith in God? Can the two co-exist? **"The religion of Christ counts for little with us if it does not enable us to do more than others who know not its secret."** J.R. Miller.

Faith and Belief go 'hand in hand'. Faith requires us to be courageous, to take steps even if we do not know what the future holds. Scripture clearly demonstrates that all those who were called:-

Believed, trusted and followed by Faith

- ◇ They loved Him
- ◇ They walked close
- ◇ They obeyed Him

They did not know necessarily what was to be expected from them, but they still trusted and followed. The question of ability was not a consideration rather **"I am willing."** God never asks us to do anything we can do through our own strength, otherwise, why would we need God!

There was a wall mounted picture in a missionary house. The picture showed an ox standing between a plough and an altar, with the inscription **"Ready for either."** The meaning was that the missionary must be ready either for toil and service, or for sacrifice on the altar, if that should be the Lord's will.

The call of God has always been by name. The response has throughout Scripture been, **"Here am I send me,"** followed by faith. Some with initial hesitation but still they followed. Being a disciple of Jesus Christ in today's culture could be considered by some extreme. There are many things in the Christian calling which, if our little human strength were all we could command, would be impossibilities. Paul says **"I have learned to be content."**

Then a little further on he says, **"I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me,"**

(Philippians 4:11)

We are at our strongest when we are weak in ourselves, because the measure of our conscious weakness is the measure of the strength Jesus imparts to us.

It is when we trustingly go forward believing, following; loving Him; walking and obeying that we go forward confidently in the strength we are given. No matter how difficult, how seemingly impossible the task may be, we must instantly obey. Romans 10:17 teaches that faith grows as we hear and respond to God's Word. Hebrews 11 (Faith's Hall of Fame) cites men and women who had faith in God and staked their lives on promises. Many experienced great victories as they laid hold on his promises. Others suffered greatly and were killed without receiving their promised inheritance except in Glory. Yet God commended all as **Faithful**. They are our spiritual role models.

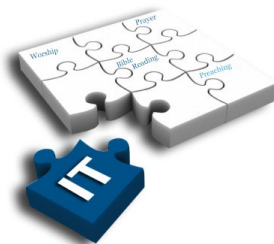

Five pound note

Do take a look at a five pound note. In the bottom right hand corner you will see a portrait of Elizabeth Fry, famous for her work in the area of prison reform. Thomas Buxton did not only spend himself on behalf of those in slavery, but also worked alongside Elizabeth Fry who was his sister in law. He is in the top left hand corner of the note wearing glasses, one of a group visiting the notorious Newgate Prison to witness the Christian work among women and children imprisoned there. Thomas had a huge heart for the poor and oppressed. He lived mainly in East London, where the Buxton Leadership Programme has been set up in his memory, enabling young people to combine church-based inner city experience with a placement in Parliament.

Although an MP, Thomas Buxton was in many ways an unremarkable man, who would have loved to lead a peaceful life on his country estate. He didn't naturally enjoy the rough and tumble of politics and was not a particularly gifted speaker, but God took hold of him to bring about His purposes. Buxton commented that 'with ordinary talent and extraordinary perseverance, all things are attainable' This is true of each one of us as we ask God to move in and through our lives in partnership with others.

Perhaps you don't see yourself as particularly significant, but who knows what seeds you have sown and what an encouragement you have been to others in your life?

Intercessors For Britain or Asking God For Britain

Awhile ago, we spent four days with Intercessors for Britain, with about 50 others in North Wales. It was a gathering of like-minded people concerned for our nation.

There were three main aspects – worship, prayer and Bible teaching. Meals and break times were great opportunities to meet new people, hear what the Lord was doing in their churches and areas. It was all very stimulating and encouraging.

Worship featured before each session using songs, scripture, and personal worship and praise.

All were given a well-informed introduction presenting the needs for intercession. One by one individuals would appeal to our great God to act, intervene, give wisdom, discernment etc. People prayed in rapid succession, to such a degree that it was difficult to get in. One session concentrated on one subject and lasted about three quarters of an hour.

We had Bible exposition on Colossians and three sessions on the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

IFB invites people to join them, asking people to pray each week for our nation. On joining a bi-monthly informative bulletin giving information for prayer is sent.

To God be the glory, great things He hath done,
So loved He the world that He gave us his Son,
Who yielded His life an atonement for sin'

Praise the Lord, praise the Lord,

This hymn was written in America by the blind lady, Fanny Crosby sometime before 1875 but was soon forgotten. It was one of more than eight thousand hymns that she wrote in her lifetime, but it was never mentioned in her writings. However, it was introduced to British congregations by Ira D. Sankey when he came over with D.L. Moody in 1873 and they kept singing it.

Cliff Barrows who was music leader for Billy Graham heard this hymn sung with great joy when they came over to England for their first crusade in 1952, and suggested to Billy that they include it in London Crusade song book for the 1954 meetings in Harringay Arena, and it became their theme tune before the end of that crusade. When they returned to America, and sung it at successive meetings it became very popular over there also.

Not only is it a wonderful hymn of praise to our God, giving Him the glory, as the Westminster Confession says, "the chief end of man is to glorify God and to enjoy Him for ever." It also spells out the simple message of the gospel, that God's love for the world caused Him to give His beloved Son, Jesus, to atone for our sin and that those who truly believe in Him, even the vilest of us, can be pardoned from both the guilt and the power of our sin.

The apostle Paul exclaimed, "God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ." (Galatians 6:14) We bring nothing to our own salvation; it is all of God. Therefore we can take no credit for it. To God be the glory!

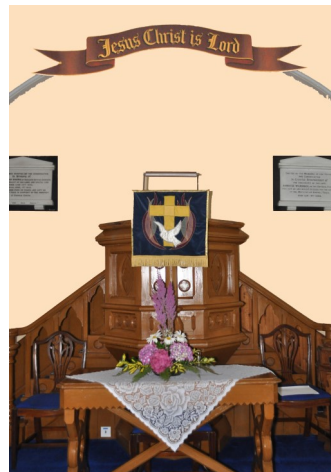

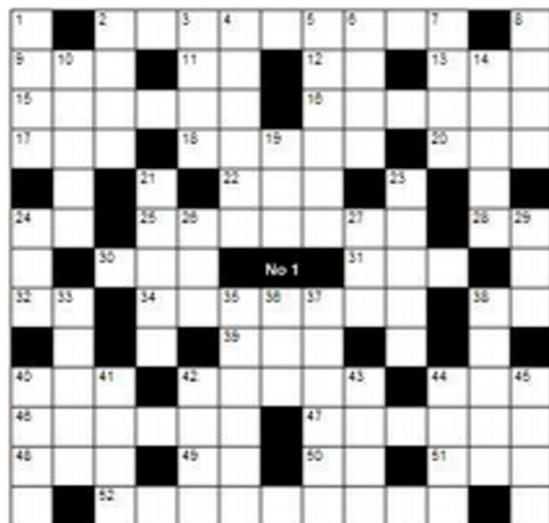
