9. 45am Devotional Service

This takes place every Sunday morning excluding the 1st Sunday in the month. This Service is facilitated by a Church member. It is Devotional in orientation, is an open Service and attendees are encouraged (optional) to take part through reading of Scripture; sharing of testimonies; choose a hymn/Worship song etc. This Service offers you the opportunity to be still; Seek God and listen to what God through the Holy Spirit is saying; to share; encourage; bless and share in the Believers Breaking of Bread.

11.00am Family Service

This is a traditionally structured family Service. It is led from the front by the Pastor of the Church (1st and 2nd of the month) and invited speakers thereafter.

2.30pm Agape Fellowship Meeting (1st Sunday ONLY)

This is a 'MUST' for all. It takes place every 1st Sunday. We recognise the fact that increasingly Christians are becoming more isolated and marginalized hence this Service. It is more of a celebration/fellowship meeting. We share a meal (bring and share). This follows on after our usual tea/coffee recess. The gathering gives insight into the Church and the opportunity to meet Church members. We also recognise that we have a number who travel in and miss out on fellowship hence the need to be part of the family and enjoy each other's fellowship. Knowle Green remains unspoilt and is a designated ' Area of natural outstanding beauty'. On a good day take the opportunity to explore the Ribble Valley. If you have not come prepared (brought food with you) please do still join us. Your fellowship means a lot to us.

Visitors

If you are visiting, we welcome you to the service. We hope that you will be at home with us and experience the presence of God as we worship together. If this is your first visit, please sign in the visitors' Book in the foyer and we would love you to stay with us for coffee after the service. Daniel "resolved not to defile himself."

(Daniel Chapter 1-3)

Our world has seen much freedom in the last few decades. Very few people, however, really are free. Most live in bondage of one form or another to such things as fear, the future, guilt, uncertainties, inner turmoil's etc. We live in challenging times. The Freedom of thought, Conscience and religion and Freedom of expression are being redefined. In all likelihood the 'British values' will precede and replace extensively the known values and practices we have enjoyed for generations. The new expression 'British values' will in due course legislatively be imposed and it will seem an 'alien culture' to what we have known. It will without doubt be an 'alien culture'. Are you ready for the new challenge?

'What has been will be again, what has been done will be done again; there is nothing new under the sun that has been before.' ((Ecclesiastes 1:9). If you've ever wished God would come and show himself, boosting your faith and striking awe into the hearts of mankind look in the book of Daniel where it tells of a miraculous rescue, the humbling of pagan kings and how God would intervened.

The name Daniel means "God is judge". Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah were just teenagers when they were forcibly extracted from Judah and exiled to Babylon (modern-day Iraq), stripped literally of their human rights. They were catapulted into a society and culture with life choices that were totally alien to them. They had no rights, 'Freedom of thought, Conscience and religion & Freedom of expression'. They were stripped of their identity and rebranded with Babylonian names. Daniel changed to Beltesshazzar, Hananiah to Shadrach, Mishael to Meshach, and Azariah to Abednego. They were **compelled to learn** and to **be re-educated** for three years in the norms of Babylonianlism. It was a **compulsory** state sponsored education coupled with 'Ofsted inspection' towering over them. The King ordered Ashpenaz, chief of the court officials, to teach and supervise their education. Daniel and his friends had tough decisions to make:-

Option 1 'Go with the flow for an easy life'.

Option 2 'Come up with excuses for conforming.'

Option 3 'Insist on staying faithful and obedient to serving the God whom they and their forefathers had known for generations'.

Daniel and his friends dutifully obeyed initially as directed but they also drew a 'red line'. They were offered **the very best** of the king's food and royal wine. Daniel "**resolved not to defile himself**." He asked the chief official for permission not to defile himself this way. God graciously caused the official to show favour and sympathy to Daniel. Daniel took a risk but was also prepared for whatever consequence awaited him. Daniel and his associates were in due course instrumental in becoming the saving grace of Babylon.

One of the biggest challenges facing those who profess Jesus as Lord and Saviour, individually and corporately, will be in deciding what is central to our faith, what our "red line" is and what is simply the result of our own history, background and tradition.

God said to Joshua in the face of stiff opposition "**Do not be discouraged. Be strong and courageous**". (Joshua 10:25). We can be certain that whenever we go out to battle in the authority of Almighty God, we can be assured that God goes with us and He makes available to us his heavenly resources. Someone has said that obedience is, "**Doing exactly what one is told to do when one is told to do it, with a good spirit**." God expects obedience. Our spiritual success or failure depends on it.

As we approach the season of Christmas let us be thankful, remember why Jesus came as a baby, fully God yet fully man, and pray for our world. Pray for our brothers and sisters across the nations and cities, for our neighbours, friends and families. That in the midst of the celebrations and holidays we will remember "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on His shoulders." (Isaiah 9:6). This is God's plan.



God Bless you all as we move into what the Lord Jesus Christ has for us in His Sovereign will and governance for 2016.

And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judea, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be taxed with Mary, his espoused wife, being great with child. Luke 2:4&5

The hymn, or more correctly, Christmas carol 'O little town of Bethlehem' was written by the Rev Phillips Brooks. He was born in Boston, America in 1835 and after graduating from Harvard and then the Episcopal Theological Seminary in Virginia in 1859 he became a minister of the gospel and pastor serving in Philadelphia from 1859 – 69 and then in Boston from 1869 – 91 before being made bishop of Massachusetts till his death in 1893.

Phillips was a big man in every respect, standing 6ft. 6ins tall, but he was also a powerful preacher of the gospel, and though never married, he had a great love for children and them for him. He had visited the Holy Land in 1865 and spent Christmas that year in Bethlehem, where Jesus was born, and the town made a great impression on him.

Three years later, as he was preparing a sermon for the celebration of the Saviour's birth, he was pacing the floor of his study, but no inspiration was coming. He could hear from the church organ the strains of some music the organist and Sunday School teacher Lewis Redner was practising for the same occasion. Brooks' mind went back to the Christmas he spent in Bethlehem and his thoughts took in the scene of the birth of Jesus as recorded by Luke in his gospel. For a time he forgot the sermon and began to write the words of the still popular Christmas carol, "O Little Town of Bethlehem". He soon completed the four verses and took them to the organist and asked if he could compose a tune so that the children could sing it that Christmas, and he did.

What a joy it would be for the children to have a new carol to sing that year, and one written by their very own minister. Such was their love for their Pastor that when he died in 1893, one little 5 year old girl said, with tears in her eyes, "How happy the angels will be."


Sadly, the town of Bethlehem is not so peaceful in our day and age. The majority of the population are now Muslims who deny that Jesus was the Son of God, they also hate the Jewish people from whom Jesus, in his human nature was descended, and though there are a small number of Palestinian Christians living there, life is very difficult for them. May the Lord guard them this Christmas and add to their number many from the Muslim people.

O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see you lie! Above your deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by: Yet in your dark streets shineth the everlasting light; The hopes and fears of all the years are met in you tonight.

For Christ is born of Mary, and gathered all above, While mortals sleep, the angels keep their watch of wondering love. O morning stars, together proclaim the holy birth, And praises sing to God the King and peace to men on earth.

How silently, how silently the wondrous gift is given! So God imparts to human hearts the blessings of his heaven. No ear may hear his coming but in this world of sin, Where meek souls will receive him, still the dear Christ enters in.

O Holy Child of Bethlehem, descend to us we pray; Cast out our sin, and enter in; be born in us today. We hear the Christmas angels the great glad tidings tell; O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Immanuel.
