

#### "History is just news from the graveyard"

Writer, Earnest Poole wrote a novel entitled 'The Harbor'. The main character of the story is a bespectacled elderly gentleman who is impatient with life in general. He is "agin" everything. He has a violent history and keeps repeating "History is just news from the graveyard." This main character echoes the Easter Message, "Good News from the Graveyard".

Easter is the one occasion when **Sonrise** is embraced by Christians and is celebrated throughout the whole world. It is a time of great celebration. The coming of other days may come with fear, but not Easter. All across the globe Christians gather early in the morning to recall, remember, reflect and to hear again the Good News of Christ's resurrection. What makes this day different or shall I say makes Easter day very unique? Easter through Jesus Christ gives us the Gospel which means "**Good News**". There is very little good news nowadays. It is as though the world itself is on a collision course and on fire. The atmosphere and the prevailing climate is one of hate, prejudice, war and many great uncertainties. Don't we all need some Good News?

"Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb and they asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?" (Mark 16: 1-2). They were on their way to the graveyard. A 'universal pathway' which awaits us all. It is also known as a "trail of tears." The last thing the women expected was to hear some 'Good News.' Who would expect 'Good News' from a gravevard? Until that first Easter, the news from the graveyard was always 'doom and gloom.' It was and still is bad news to many. We who were born will die. 'We live for the grave'. One's life might be good, wonderful and successful; but it is also fearful, temporal and perishing. The Bible says "It is appointed to man once to die and then to face judgement." (Hebrews 9:27). The 'Good News' of Easter destroys the fear of death, Paul the Apostle wrote, "O death, where is thy sting; O grave where is thy victory?" Because of the Easter 'Good News', The Christian's response to death, the grave, the terror of death and all the embodiment death can throw at us is "I thank my God who gives us victory through Christ Jesus." (1 Cor. 15:57).

Jesus declares the Good News. Jesus clearly states that the grave was not the end; "For God so loved the world, that he gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish (die), but have eternal (everlasting) life. (John 3:16). "I give them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand" (John 10:28) "I am the resurrection, and the life; he that lives and believes in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live." (John 11:25-26).

<u>Jesus proves the Good News.</u> Jesus died on the cross. The Bible says that He gave up his spirit. (Matt. 27:50). The soldier said he was dead. The agents of Ceasar said he was dead. Joseph of Arimathea, who claimed his body, declared he was dead. The witnesses at the crucifixion witnessed his death. But Jesus said "I AM Alive for ever and ever more!" (Revelation 1:18). On the third day he arose from the grave.

The disciples declared the Good News. (Mark 16:7-8). You can read the resurrection story in any of the Gospels for yourself. "The women hurried from the tomb... and ran (Matt 28:8); Mary Magdalene came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved" (John 20:2); Peter and the other disciples started for the tomb. Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first (John 20: 4). The one thing these people all had in common was the fact that they were all running. People bearing great news /Good News are always in a hurry to pass it on (tell others).

Forgiveness for the past. We all have a past we are not proud of. Many, sadly try to give the impression of having been very good all their lives and have no 'skeletons in the cupboard'. The Bible says "for all have sinned (done wrong) and have fallen short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23). Can any of us deny this fact? 'If we claim to be without sin (wrong doing), we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. ( 1 John 1:8). The disciples had all deserted Jesus at his point of need. Peter denied he ever knew Jesus. Judas took money from the purse; Yet on this special Easter morning, Jesus wanted to see them (Mark 16:7) We might deny Him, turn our backs on Him; do wrong etc. but Isn't that just like Jesus to want to see us? I know I have done wrong; I know I have deserted, denied, doubted, gone my own way etc. and yet Jesus would say, I still love you, and I want to see you. From the Cross Jesus cried "Father forgive them." The Bible says, "The blood of Jesus cleanseth us from all sin." (John 1:7). The heart of the Easter message is that God forgives, God loves.

Joy for the Present. The disciples were disappointed and discouraged. (Mark 16:11). They had seen Jesus, their carer, provider, hope, comforter, motivator, Saviour, Master, and friend, put to death and buried. The world was crashing down around them. There was nothing left to live for. Have you ever felt that life had lost its meaning? Life is 'slipping through your fingers', desperately clinging on for dear life? Has the death of a close friend or a loved one robbed you of your desire to go on? Life is tough and you are gasping for the very 'breath of life'? Easter is Good News! John 20:20 says, "Then were the disciples glad, when they saw the Lord." Their despair had turned to joy. Suddenly they were not alone: Jesus had walked back into their lives. Jesus is not a memory anymore; he is real and living. 'Hope deferred makes the heart sick, but a longing fulfilled is a tree of life' (Proverb 13:12 ) This is the truth about the Easter message. Jesus can be real joy and peace each day. "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives." (John 14:27) Cont'd overleaf

**Hope for the Future.** The Good News from the graveyard is that Christ has conquered death and hell. Paul the Apostle says that "the last enemy that shall be destroyed is death" (1Corn. 15:26). This is confirmed by John in his vision that "death and hell were cast into the lake of fire." (Rev 20:14) The disciples were glad, hope restored, longing fulfilled, that Jesus had survived the grave, that He had conquered it. Easter is a true story that 'took a tragedy and made it a triumph'. Death and the graveyard ought not to be a tragedy story. Because of Easter we have Good News to share. The last verse of the book of Mark says: They went forth, and preached everywhere, the Lord working with them, confirming the Word with signs following. (Mark 16:20) You may be thinking, "I wish I had that kind of confidence and assurance. I wish I had that joy and peace. The promise of God is this. "Ask and it shall be given, **Seek** and you shall find, **Knock** and the door will be opened." (Matt. 7;7) "To all who received Him, to those who believed in his name, He gave the right to become children of God." (John 1:12). "If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be pitied more than all men." (1 Cor. 15:19) We live in a world riddled with tragedy. Consistently through the media we are reminded of the 'fragility of life'. The ultimate tragedy is to 'live and die without hope of eternity'. Jesus offers this hope and it is 'free' to any who would have it. A prayer of Salvation follows this letter, why not take a moment, pray and ask the Lord Jesus Christ into your life.


#### End of Month Day of Prayer and Fasting Prayer Meeting

#### **Is evolution Science**

Scientists and astronomers have observed that the sun is shrinking because of the vast amounts of energy it gives out. This can be understood as you sit on a beach on a hot summer's day in Britain, how much more so in Africa or other hot countries of the world. That is just the bit that is reaching you but the sun's heat must go out in every direction from its surface, day and night, and has been doing so for several thousand years.

But when you introduce billions of years into the equation, that is a whole different ball game. The sun in that case would have been so huge at the beginning that it would have been touching the earth, yet evolutionists claim that there have been several ice ages in the distant past. They claim that the earth somehow gradually cooled down, before warming up again. However, how this happened they have no idea. In that case, the sea would freeze over and there would be no evaporation, so you would end up with a frozen desert, not an ice age.

The truth is that there has been an ice age and the Bible gives us an understanding of how it could happen. It almost certainly came about as a result of the world-wide flood in Noah's day. In the first 1600 years of the world's existence the climate must have been very different, with lush vegetation everywhere as evidenced by oil in the Arctic circle and the Arabian desert. Oil and coal were formed when vegetation was suddenly buried by some cataclysmic event.

We are told that there is enough water on earth to cover it to a depth of 1.7 miles if the surface was level, but the Bible tells us that most of that water was under a considerable depth of earth when God created it. Then at a time of God's choosing, the earth's crust split and the 'Fountains of the great deep burst forth' (Genesis 7:11) falling as rain on the earth. That water would be carrying large amounts of silt which would settle in

large amounts of silt which would settle in layers, burying many creatures instantly, including fish to form the fossils that we find in rock today. As the outer shell of the earth collapsed, it would be too big and would crumple into valleys and mountains. The water that would settle in the deepest places would be hot or very warm and vast amounts of steam and volcanic ash would blot out the sun over large parts of the earth, creating an ice age. This would last until eventually the seas also cooled and the skies cleared allowing the melting process to begin. Of course we still have some water left under the earth in the aguifers which provide water for bore holes. The sad thing is that

evolutionists deny that there ever was a world flood.

Alison was warm and friendly and soon became a welcome member of the fellowship. She was in remission from cancer and she was a biker and a member of CMA (Christian Motorcycle Association as it is now called). Chris was also a biker and between them with the



tacit agreement of the church they decided to start a Christian outreach to bikers in conjunction with CMA. The biker breakfast at Knowle Green was born.

We soon discovered that CMA members are passionate about bringing the Christian gospel to the motorcycling community, they are passionate about sharing the gospel message of peace and love and that they have a wonderful way of blending in with non believing bikers in a non threatening way. The shared love of the open road and bikes for these leather clad riders is a firm basis for contact. And Knowle Green has proved to be a great venue for the meeting of all bikers from throughout the north west – we have had a hundred bikers in on a Saturday morning all enjoying a free biker brekkie and brew.

Some eyebrows were raised when the idea was first floated: bikers were young, noisy tearaways' and would upset the locals and a free breakfast would cost the church money. Wrong, wrong, wrong.

On the occasion of the first biker breakfast the bikers arrived, removed their helmets and in the main were of the mature age group. Recycled teenagers? Most of those first arrivals were members of CMA, they had respect for the local area and community and to this day there has not been a complaint about them despite the increasing numbers. Neither has the breakfast been a drain on church funds. Rather it has added to the funds. At the end of the season monies raised by donations for the breakfasts are split three ways: one third to the church, one third to CMA to help with the finance of the free bibles and literature available at events and rallies attended by the bikers and the final third retained to kick start the next season of breakfasts.

Sadly Alison succumbed to the cancer before she could see the fulfilment of her dream but her legacy lives on. There are many road signs these days that say: Think Bike. At Knowle Green on the last Saturday of the month from March to October, we think eggs, bacon, sausage, baked beans, toast and a brew. If you haven't yet seen the car park full of gleaming bikes of all makes and sizes, then make a date to come along, meet the bikers and share with them a hearty biker brekkie.

From the earliest days there were soon bikers of all faiths and none regularly visiting Knowle Green. All are made welcome and the love of Jesus is presented in a non threatening way. Free bibles and tracts are available and the church, at the bikers request, is now always open for any who wish to spend time in quiet prayer and contemplation. The enthusiasm of the CMA members to share the gospel is infectious and vibrant, "over the top" some might say, but appeals to all bikers and their love of the Lord is obvious for all to see. Peoples lives have been changed by their visit to Knowle Green Biker Breakfast.

I could have told you about the Congregational Federation Community Project Award 2011 we won for the breakfasts, I could have told you about the Christian message that went live over the airways one Saturday morning when Radio Lancashire broadcast from the breakfast, I could have told you that from this first vision other biker breakfasts have been started or I could have told you about some of the characters in the biker community like Big Phil, a convicted criminal, a larger than life character in every sense of the word, loved by all the bikers, who sadly went to be with the Lord some time ago and whose ashes were laid to rest in our Garden of Remembrance. Big Phil told all he met, "Jesus loves you".

Thank you Alison and Chris for your vision, thank you Steve and Mel for continuing that vision and thank you to the team for their input at each breakfast – 100 breakfasts in three hours is work, hard work but very rewarding work. Why not come along on Saturday 26th March, 9am until noon, meet the bikers, enjoy a breakfast with them and allow some of the joy, enthusiasm and love of the Lord affect you because Jesus really does love you.
