"To everything there is a season, a time for every

purpose under heaven:"

(Ecclesiastes 3:1)

What has your year been like so far? The answer to this question I would guess varies from one household to another. Some have and are battling with persistent health issues; unemployment; getting married; moving home; financial challenges; promotion in the work place etc. It is a cocktail of good news and disappointment. Whatever the experience we can still praise God in the midst of the storm.

Someone said "**if you are on your knees you cannot fall**." The best place to be for all of us always is on our knees. The most dangerous place is when we become confident in ourselves, our resolve and in our own ability.

The difference between God and man is that man often leaves you when your trouble comes. God, however says He will be "**ever present and He will be your help in times of trouble**," no matter what the circumstance.

"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." (Ps. 46:1)

When God pours out His blessing on us, we need to remain humble. When we are at the zenith of life, it is easy to fall down. The best place to be is in the **second place**. The person in front of the queue is usually in a very precarious position. When we think we are ahead, that is when we need to be most on our guard.

Whatever our lot we always have to get into the habit and habitually '**Count our blessings, name then one by one and see what the Lord has done'** if we are not already doing so. Choosing to count our blessings is ever so helpful in very difficult times because it not only reminds us of God's faithfulness but also speaks of His goodness and mercy. It strengthens our faith and lifts us out of our despair. We always think ours is the worst until we are exposed to another's situation.

The Bible tells us quite clearly that without faith we cannot please God. What is faith you may ask! **Faith is believing** in something you have not seen, trusting that what God has promised He will do. Our part is to make sure that we have done everything He expects of us – the possible – and **He will do** the impossible.

Taking our eyes off Jesus will leave us disillusion. **'Guard what has been entrusted to you.'** (1 Tim 6:20)

The road of discouragement and disillusionment is a gradual process. It starts with:-

1. Taking our eyes of the 'Author and finisher of our faith; The Lord Jesus Christ.'

2. Feeling inadequate, not good enough, cannot be bothered. A feeling of despair.

3. Pointing the finger at others. Apportioning blame. "It is all their fault".

4. Withdrawal from fellowship. The Kingdom suffers then Self interest (I, Me, Mine) takes over.

5. Denial sets in leading to a spirit of justification and self righteousness.

6. In due course we become the kind of Christian who has no need of fellowship with other believers. The Bible speaks of this ' Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another – and all the more as you see the Day approaching'. (Heb.10:25)

Jesus Himself experienced many discouraging situations and disappointments yet <u>He learned obedience through suffering</u>. 'There is no such thing as spiritual growth with maturity without trials, hardship, difficulties and suffering' "I have tested you in the furnace of suffering." (Isaiah 48:10). A poem called "In His Footsteps" speaks of a man walking in difficult territory. At one stage he could see only one set of footprints in the sand and he cried out, "Lord, where were You when the going was tough?" The Lord said, "Those are my footprints. I was carrying you."

Do not lose sight of Him. Remain humble; let Him ever be your source of strength. If you are going through a storm. Remember, '**I will never leave you nor forsake you.**' (Hebrews 13:5).

Of late I have been drawn to Psalm 42 – 44. It contains a wealth of advice in counsel rather than ideas. The principles are of abiding values. They strengthen and sustain when we are filled with doubts and buffeted by a storm. We can observe that even when problems and difficulties beset us the psalms provide us with the answers we need in our personal walk with the Lord. Be encouraged in the Lord, 'why are you downcast, O my soul?' 'Why so disturbed within me?' 'Put your hope in God for I will yet praise Him, my Saviour and my God.'

On Sunday 10th of July Andrew & Jonathan began the bike ride at 8:00am outside the Imperial War Museum in Manchester.


By Preston Andrew could cycle no further and went to get the car whilst Jonathan continued on to Blackpool.
