This is a 'MUST' for all. It takes place every 1st Sunday. We recognise the fact that increasingly Christians are becoming more isolated and marginalized hence this Service. It is more of a celebration/fellowship meeting. We share a meal (bring and share). This follows on after our usual tea/coffee recess. The gathering gives insight into the Church and the opportunity to meet Church members. We also recognise that we have a number who travel in and miss out on fellowship hence the need to be part of the family and enjoy each other's fellowship. Knowle Green remains unspoilt and is a designated 'Area of natural outstanding beauty'. On a good day take the opportunity to explore the Ribble Valley. If you have not come prepared (brought food with you) please do still join us. Your fellowship means a lot to us.

If you are visiting, we welcome you to the service. We hope that you will be at home with us and experience the presence of God as we worship together. If this is your first visit, please sign in the visitors' Book in the foyer and we would love you to stay with us for coffee after the service. "Then the Word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time." (Jonah 3:1)

I am lost for words in the way and manner the United States of America presidential election is being conducted. The primary focus of each candidate seems to centre on the opponents frailty, failings, mistakes, personality and very little substance on policy details and their vision for the future. The thrust of the debate is centred on finance, the economy and very little on social welfare and the morality in the state of the nation. This takes me back on reflection to the story of Jonah, **"Then the Word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time." (Jonah 3:1)**

Jonah had wilfully disobeyed God's call to preach in Nineveh. God gave him another chance. We need to remember three things about second chances; God's will is going to be accomplished with us or without us; God intended to warn Nineveh, and Nineveh would be warned, whether Jonah or some other person was God's agent; Jonah's disobedience deserved God's discipline, not His rejection! God gave Jonah a **second chance**. God also gives you and me a second chance. God graciously gives us many opportunities to respond to His guidance. So often it is the case that He has to prompt us because, like Jonah, we refuse to heed to His calling. We excuse ourselves and then go into the blame culture.

When Jonah eventually responded to God's calling he went and preached as instructed. (Jonah 3:1-10) The Bible says the **'Assyrians repented.'** This did not go down well with Jonah. Jonah, upset and angry, cried! **"Now, O Lord, take away my life,"** Jonah asked God to let him die (4:1-4). God used a vine as an object lesson to teach Jonah a lesson in values. God is a God of compassion. He does not judge us as our sins deserve. He is slow to anger and abounding in love. He remembers we are but dust. **"Jonah was very happy about the vine". (Jonah 4:5-6)** As he sat on a distant hill overlooking Nineveh, to wallowed in self-pity and waited to see what would happen to the city. As he sat a vine sprang from the ground and grew large enough to provide

shade. Jonah was happy for more than the shade. Such a little thing. Jonah was pleased that here in the desert was something green and living and he was comforted by its presence. He was sullen and angry about Nineveh's repentance. The issue with Nineveh was that, **"Nineveh has more than a 120,000 people who cannot tell their right hand from their left, and many cattle (wealth) as well. Should I not be concern about that great city?" (Jonah 4:11).**

Jonah's mission was a simple one. Go to Nineveh, to a thriving cosmopolitan city teaming with human beings. Thousands of lives were at stake. When God places a calling on our lives it is to be done HIS WAY and not as we think it ought to be. Like many of us, Jonah thought God should do as he wanted him to. Isn't such a reaction all too typical? We have it all figured out, and are sure that God would solve this way, and another that way, we sulk or become angry. What we should do in such a case is thank God that He didn't do it our way! Our idea of how things should be is limited by our lack of knowledge, our inexperience in the things of God- and often by our lack of love and care. God not only knows what is best, He loves always. Thanking God even when His decisions do not reflect our first choice is a sign of spiritual maturity.

When Jonah was out of fellowship with the Lord, God used him to save, a ship load. But when Jonah was back in fellowship, and went on to Nineveh, God used him to save a whole city! Ask God to make us a BIG Blessing. He can use us more if we stay in fellowship with Him. Always aim to serve God wholeheartedly, and enjoy His calling.

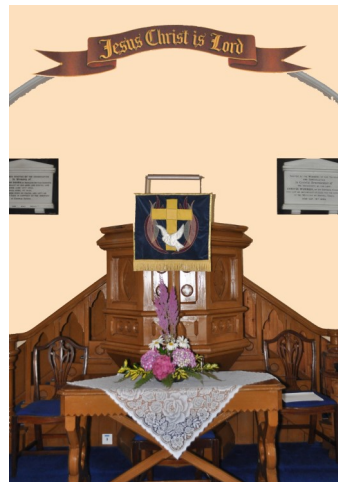

GIFT AID AND GIVING—Tom Mellor

Under the government's GIFT AID scheme every contribution, however small, can benefit the church, provided that the giver is a tax payer. The giver must pay an amount of income tax and/or capital gains tax at least equal to the tax the church reclaims on the donation in the appropriate tax year.

If you do not pay tax you should not gift aid.

You can boost your donation by 25p of Gift Aid for every £1 you donate. Members of the fellowship who are not part of this scheme, pay tax, and wish to enhance their giving, by enabling the church to claim back the tax paid, would sign a gift aid declaration and be given a personal reference number.

To maintain confidentiality, the church has sealable gift aid envelopes on the church pews into which gift aid givers place their offering and write their personal number on the back, together with the date. This number is known only to the church treasurer who has to satisfy HMRC requirements that all donations can be traced back to the giver, if required.

Occasional visitors to church wishing to gift aid an offering/donation would need to complete their name and address details on the back of the gift aid envelope, thereby acknowledging their wish to gift aid.
