We also recognise that we have a number who travel in and miss out on fellowship hence the need to be part of the family and enjoy each other's fellowship. Knowle Green remains unspoilt and is a designated ' Area of natural outstanding beauty'. On a good day take the opportunity to explore the Ribble Valley. If you have not come prepared ( brought food with you) please do still join us. Your fellowship means a lot to us.

#### Visitors

If you are visiting, we welcome you to the service. We hope that you will be at home with us and experience the presence of God as we worship together. If this is your first visit, please sign in the visitors' Book in the foyer and we would love you to stay with us for coffee after the service. ### From the Pastor's Desk

#### May you be blessed in this New Year.

#### "May those who bless you be blessed" (Numbers 24:9)

You may have noticed immediately from my introduction that I have not wished you a 'Happy New Year'. Why is this? Firstly, I do not sit comfortably with the word happy or have an incline for the word. The word somehow seems devoid of deeper meaning and can seem superficial. Maybe with reservation '**joyous**' is my preferred word to use. We are living in very difficult and treacherous, 'toxic', times and if anything we want to know God's blessing '**for such a time as this'**. The word Bless on the other hand is accompanied with Divine authority and mandate. It is very rich in both content and meaning. The very first blessing invoked was by God Himself in Genesis, The Beginning, in the Old Testament.

God **blessed** them and said, "Be fruitful and multiply". (Gen. 1:22)

It is also a significant point to observe that the very first sermon in the New Testament (New Covenant) begins with the same word 'Bless'. Jesus' first major public address was the 'Sermon on the mount'. (Mathew 5:1- 11) "Blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the Kingdom of God". (Matthew 5:3)

Jesus uses the word **Bless** 9 times in the Sermon. The book of Revelation also ends with a blessing. **"Blessed are those who wash their robes, that they may have the right to the tree of life and may go through the gates into the city". (Revelation 22: 14)**. The word is concurrent throughout the Scriptures.

The word "blessed" is ever active. Past, Present and Future. Whenever the word is used in Scripture it is accompanied with either a divine impartation, visitation or a move of God.

God it appears is not in the business of making us happy. He is in the business of Blessing and pouring out His blessing on His people and any who would call on Him even when they feel undeserving. '**He causes His sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. If you love those who love you, what reward will you get?' (Matthew 5:45)**. Blessing, when it is pronounced in the right spirit (not religiously as a matter of course) and in the appropriate manner has with it God's blessing and authority. The Beneficiaries of a blessing are as those honoured, privileged, to be envied and receive favour when a blessing is conferred.

It is the greatest honour that anyone could confer on us, a blessing. When a blessing is invoked it often implies the person is conferring something with eternal value and significance. It should not be invoked in a casual manner but when we truly mean it and we are in a right relationship with God.

#### "May those who bless you be blessed". (Nu 24:9)

Let us look at some examples of its usage:-

Blessed is the man who fears the Lord. (Psalm 112:1)

Bless all his skills, O Lord. (Psalm 72:11)

Blessed are those who maintain justice. (Psalm 106:3)

Blessed is the man who listens to me (Proverbs 8:34)

Blessed are all who wait for him (Isaiah 30:18)

Blessed is the man who has regard for the weak. (Psalm 41:1)

My prayer is this, that The Almighty God of Heaven and His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ bless you and your family, the skills of your hands; the peace of your mind; your labour; plans; health and witness; and as a fellowship of believers we are encouraged and built up in Him and fulfil His calling to which we have been called, to reach the lost for Christ.

The Lord Bless you and keep you;

The Lord make his face shine upon you;

The Lord be gracious to you;

The Lord turn his face towards you and give you peace (now and throughout 2017). Number Chapter 6:6

## Charis Ministries Update 2016/17

'Let the rivers of your justice flow through us. Let us hear the cries of the poor, the oppressed, the broken. Let us be your hands and feet and lead us to the widow and the orphan.' (Compassion Art CD)

Isaiah 58: 6-12 remains one of the key biblical passages, which informs our GRACE calling and work amongst the poor of Mozambique. We continue to believe that reaching out practically with the love of God to the poor, oppressed, forgotten, those suffering, alongside sharing the message of Christ's saving work on the Cross, defines a proper relationship with God and is true religion. As 'we spend ourselves on behalf of the poor' we believe the light of Christ will shine and others will come to know God. (Matthew 5:14-16).

We are delighted to share how God has led us to reach out to the street boys in Vilanculos in 2016. What started out as a simple invitation to 2 street boys, Xavier and Pasqual, to come and have a meal at our Vilanculos Centre, has developed into a regular twice weekly Kids Bible Club and Sunday Beach Church. The word spread quickly and 2 became 4, 4 became 8 and now there are about 15 street boys plus other local needy children attending the Centre's activities. Most of the street boys are aged between 12-15 and have similar sad stories: their parents have died, they were sent to extended family, mostly grandmas, who had no food, so they ran away to the live on the streets of Vilanculos and sleep in the market.

Joana teaches them from the bible after which we provide a meal of rice and beans or fish and they then play games. They finish by going to wash at the lake and change into the clothes we have provided.

Vision for 2017 To help the work with the children and those in need we plan to put in water and electricity on the land then build a shower and toilet block. Joana has to carry water in a bucket from the pump at the church, which although not too far, is difficult, because cooking, washing etc. requires many buckets per day! We will need to install a water pump, then build a structure for the water tank to stand on. We are trusting God for provision to carry out His work.

In the years prior to 1996 Dr Terence Ascott was concerned as to how modern satellite TV could be used to spread the gospel in closed
