We also recognise that we have a number who travel in and miss out on fellowship hence the need to be part of the family and enjoy each other's fellowship. Knowle Green remains unspoilt and is a designated 'Area of natural outstanding beauty'. On a good day take the opportunity to explore the Ribble Valley. Dear Brothers and Sisters,

History informs or shall I say is again reminding us of the fact that it is 100 years since the First World War. The phrase 'Never Again' and 'least we forget' continues to dominate every era with history ever repeating itself. What have we learnt? Not very much! Mankind it seems is incapable of establishing 'Peace on Earth'. War, rumours of War, threat of War continues to be a 'thorn in the flesh'.

Christians are in a privileged position in that we are aware of the works of the parallel Kingdoms namely The Kingdom of God and the kingdom of darkness. The Atheistic and the humanist world are confident of and have the view that man without God is able to put the world right with the aid of Science and human reasoning. This view is the very opposite to that of Scripture. One of the signs of the end of the age is 'Nations will rise up against Nations and kingdoms against Kingdoms. There will be famines and earth quakes in various places. All these are the beginnings of the birth pains' (Matthew 24: 7-8). The phrase 'Nation' in the original interpretation is 'Peoples group'. I.e. **Peoples group will rise up against peoples group'.** This is exactly what we find happening all over the world. The United Nation is increasingly becoming ideologically sectarian. Some argue it is disunited, ineffectual, a talk shop as is Europe. Each member state is looking to its own national interest.

The Good News: - God is still in charge and in control of World events and His Word to His children is do not worry. 'Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own' (Matt. 6:34). Again the inference here is the care of each day is enough to concern us. Thoughtful preparation for the future is not a rebuke, but fretting about it is condemned. Worry steals our peace, our time, saps us of our energy, we lose perspective and it can incapacitate us. 'Who of you by worrying can add a single day to his life?' (Matt. 6:27)

A man in a village opened a tin which he had buried underground and in which he had stored his life savings. "What a treasure!" he thought. But the treasure was gone. White ants had entered the tin and there was nothing but "mud" A life's work wasted! He was consumed with worry, his tomorrow had incapacitated him. Not only did he lose his peace; he lost his focus as well as his perspective. His decision to bury his life savings was flawed. Why? He had lost his faith in humanity, the institutions and trusted no one. He in turn lost his life savings and everything else in the process

Jesus instructs us not to be alarmed by events taking place around us. We are exhorted to 'seek first the Kingdom of God in all circumstance and all these things will be added to you'. Are you worried?

"Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you". So we say this with confidence "The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. Hebrew 13:5 "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus". Philp 4; 6

The Letter Writing Bible Teacher

The centrality of the Bible through the war years shines through the story of **LILLIAN HAYMAN** who ran Bible classes in Brighton and later on, in Bournemouth. During the war Hayman became a committed letter-writer, staying in touch with her Bible class pupils – her 'boys' on the front line. Her duty was to encourage them in their faith and give them hope for the future.

One of them was Phillip Bryant, who served on HMS Queen Elizabeth. On 27th March 1915 he wrote to Mrs Hayman, 'Sometimes when I have a difficult task on hand it is a great comfort to know you are in his hands, and honestly Mrs Hayman I ask God's help in everything and I am sure it's his supervision that takes me through the monotony and longing we are subjected to.'

Later that year he wrote to her, 'I will always bless you for the way you have helped me to keep on the very Narrow Path we have to tread,' adding that he felt 'God's presence in the boundless deep'.

An insight into the nature of Mrs Hayman's Bible study classes comes in exercise books kept by Samuel Ching between 1915 and 1917.

Ching was 15 at the outbreak of the war. His Sunday afternoons during World War 1 were spent immersed in the teaching of the Bible and it's application to the war. In June 1916 he studied 'sowing and reaping', quoting Psalm 126:5. He noted that 'our soldiers and sailors are sowing in tears in order that Europe may reap in joy'.

Hayman continued her classes right through to her death in 1944, aged 80.

Killer Hurricane

Peter Horrell, Texas, USA, 1967

Everything was ready. Our equipment had been moved out of our trailers, and we were now settling into the dean's home to wait. No one was to be seen on the campus; all were behind closed doors and boarded windows, waiting. The campus property and personnel had been committed into the Lord's hands. This was His property, and we were His people. The time was five in the afternoon on September 19, 1967.

The hurricane was moving at ten miles an hour across the Gulf of Mexico straight toward the Rio Grande Valley in southeast Texas. Can you imagine an oval-shaped mass 100 miles wide and 250 miles long, spinning at 175 miles an hour at the centre? Beulah, the killer hurricane, had already claimed thirty-three lives and caused damage running into millions of dollars and was now

heading directly toward us. In ten hours' time we of the Rio Grande Bible Institute and Language School could expect to be in the eye of the worst hurricane of the century.

Thousands of people had left their homes seeking shelter in school and churches which had been turned into refugee centers. Coastal towns evacuated.

As I lay down that evening wondering what to expect, the Spirit of God whispered Isaiah 26:3 to me: "You will keep in perfect peace him whose mind is steadfast ..."

And then she struck. Winds tore through the campus with tremendous force. The whole building we were in shuddered and groaned under the pressure exerted upon it. All around us Beulah unleashed her fury.

After the storm had subsided and it was safe to venture outdoors, what a sight met our eyes! Most of the trees on the campus were down, yet not one building had been destroyed. A couple of cracked windows and one demolished carport was the only damage to property.

But in other areas it was a different story. The hurricane had ripped buildings apart, torn off roofs and blown in thousands of windows. Wind and flood damage reached billions of dollars.

What had happened? As this mighty destructive power was steadily moving toward us, a yet mightier power was also in operation – the power of prayer. God's people throughout the world were praying for the Christians of this Bible institute. As the

hurricane neared the coast, it was stopped and for a couple of hours remained in the same position, gathering momentum in speed as if preparing for the kill. When it started to move again, it suddenly changed its course and moved northwest, away from us. The eye of Beulah had passed us by seventy miles! God had answered prayer.

Hurricane Beulah, the third largest hurricane of the twentieth century, struck South Texas. It battered the state for two days. The storm hit Brownsville with winds estimated at 140 miles an hour, moved northwest across South Texas to the vicinity of Alice, then turned southwest, crossed the Rio Grande between Zapata and Laredo, and finally blew itself out in Mexico. Tornadoes spawned by Beulah did extensive damage to South Texas and northeast Mexico. On September 28, President Johnson declared twenty-four counties in South Texas a disaster area. Official estimates in these counties set the number of dead at 18, the injured or sick at 9,000, and the number of homes destroyed or heavily damaged at 3,000. Property damage was estimated at \$100 million, crop damage at \$50 million. Some 300,000 people were evacuated during the storm and subsequent flooding.
